# **Education Maintenance Allowance** (EMA)

Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is eligible for pupils who are 16 or over. This award will be paid according to the total taxable household income. Payment is dependent upon attendance, attitude and behaviour.

If your son/ daughter is 16 years of age on or before 30<sup>th</sup> September 2018, they may be eligible from the beginning of the

school term. If they are 16 years of age between 1<sup>st</sup> October 2018 and 28<sup>th</sup> February 2019, they may be eligible from January 2019.
